Preface

As Simple As That is intended to enable 4-and 5-point students to practice and have a good command of the entire Band III Core 1 word list. This objective is achieved through purposeful and systematic activation of the word-stock. All its units are employed here to good effect at least seven times for students to master 1020 words and expressions so completely that they become permanent additions to their speaking, reading and writing vocabulary.

This book contains 34 units; each one of them comprises 30 words and phrases from the Band3 Corel word list, thorough learning of which by means of retrieval, practice, review, reinforcement, testing and self-testing is its ultimate goal. A particularly important role in this respect is assigned to active recall. If we want to improve our capacity to memorize information, we should recall more, not remember. A typical way a student is taught: *learn*, *learn*, *relearn*, *remember*, *remember more*, *take a test* should be superseded by *learn*, *test yourself*, *test yourself*, *test yourself*, *test yourself*, *take a test*. By testing our memory, we not only solidify our learning and assess what we know but also enhance later retention. The testing effect is real. Dozens of studies show that we will recall 50% more of learned information by testing ourselves or by being tested than by using the same amount of time to study.

Each unit also includes Jokes, Sayings and Quotes to practice the Active Vocabulary in the classroom.

Jokes are a great way to both entertain and educate students at the same time. Humor increases students' attention to study material. By making the classroom experience more comfortable and enjoyable, humor can make teaching and learning more effective. Apart from consolidating vocabulary of the unit, humor reinforces many language skills such as homonyms, homophones, similar sounding words, puns, metaphors, idioms, etc.

Incorporating inspirational quotes into our classroom is a great way to get our students motivated, thinking critically, and discussing deeply. Inspirational quotes are also an effective way to directly teach character traits and life skills that need to be reinforced.
